MIX IT UP

DO THE MATH

Learn to work with numbers. Apply what you learn as possible - whether you are **MAKING** something or managing money. Extra points for learning the metric system.

PUT YOURSELF OUT THERE

Attend meetups. **Speak** in public. Join the debate or drama club. Share your ideas. Find your voice. Build your global network. **Engage.**

4

TRAVEL UNKNOWN PATHS

Develop a **new skill**. Learn a foreign language. Play an instrument. Grow or Cook your food. Learning is a lifelong adventure.

5

BE PRESENT AND ACTIVE

Get and stay **involved** in community groups – be it community service or special interest groups. You will pick up new skills, collaborators and mentors along the way.

6

GET HANDS ON

Work with as many physical **tools** as you can. This is necessary for learning and making. Include technical, design and fabrication tools in this process.

7

BE EMPATHETIC

Listen and **Learn** from others and keep your "receptors" open. Your lens on the world will come through in your work. Ask lots of questions. **Share. Collaborate**.

8

FAIL FORWARD, FAST

Make mistakes and learn from them. Give yourself permission to PLAY and to FAIL. Then move on.

Mistakes = information.

9

ITERATE

Tweak and **adjust** your projects – you are never done. It is key to remember that **the process** is just as important as the finished product.

10

TRUST YOUR INSTINCTS

There are rules to follow and rules to bend. Trust your instincts. Sometimes you just need to say NO.
